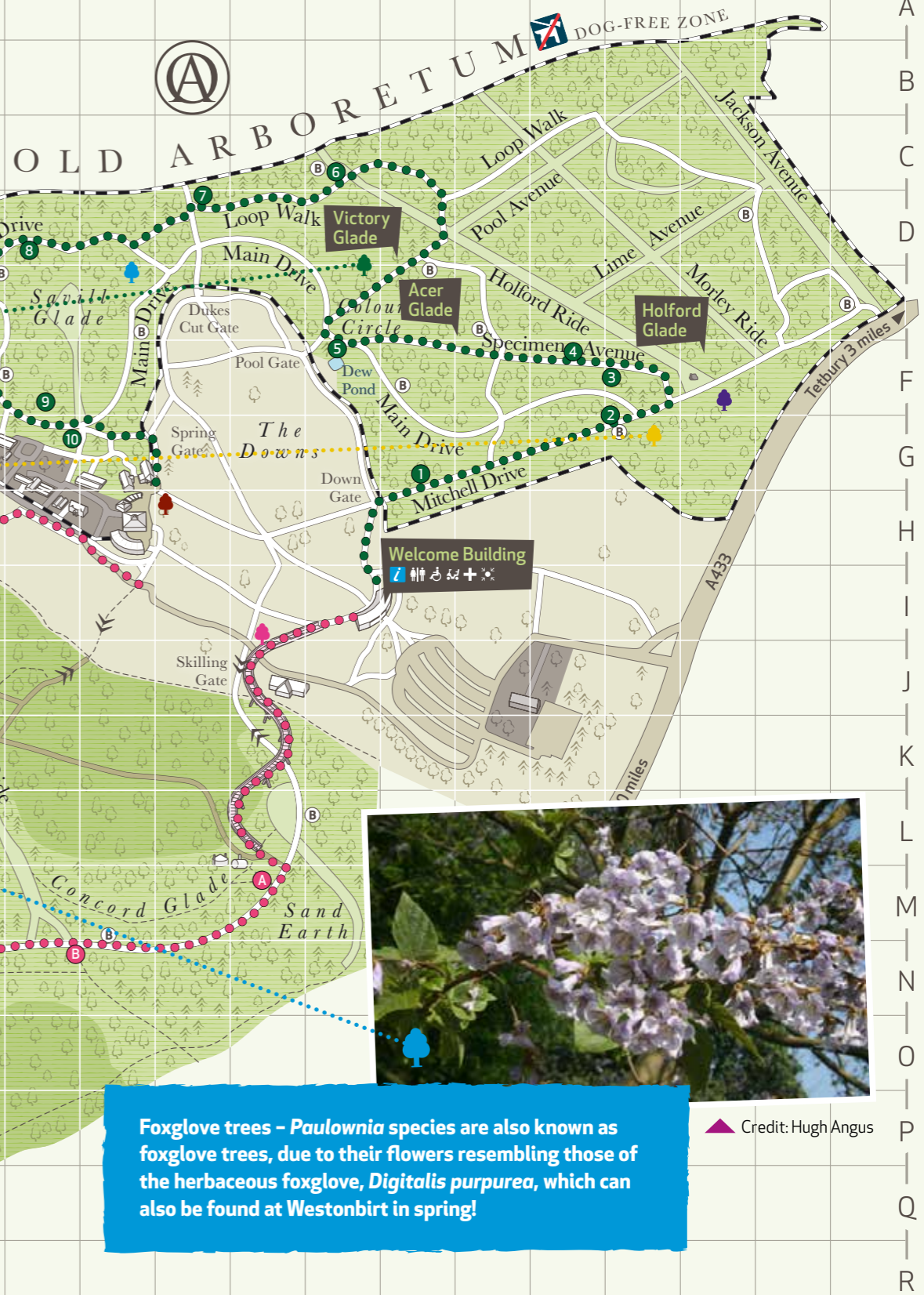
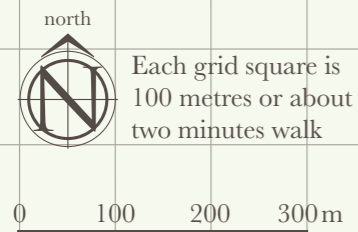
Katsura - In recent years we have planted many more examples of the species, collected from the wilds of Japan. This will ensure that we continue to grow these signature plants into the future.
